TEXTBOOK COSTS

- Since I 970s, textbook costs increased 800%
 - Direct relationship between textbook costs and student success rates
- Grossmont's Zero Textbook Cost (ZTC)
 Initiative:
 - Reduce financial barriers
 - Increase student success, access, equity
 - Comply with SB1359

LOWERING TEXTBOOK COSTS

- Not all courses have acceptable no-cost options
- Low Textbook Cost (LTC) initiative:
 - Recognize faculty efforts to reduce textbook costs
 - Allow students to make informed course registration decisions
 - Help students find affordable options
 - Comply with textbook cost transparency laws and resolutions

TEXTBOOK COST RESOLUTIONS

- ASCCC resolutions 13.01 and 03.04: "low-cost" courses
- Next steps: Disclose ALL course costs on the class schedule
 - Higher Ed. Act, section 133 (revised, 2010)
 - "...disclose...International Standard Book Number and retail price information of required and recommended college textbooks and supplemental materials for each course listed in the institution's course schedule..."
 - ASCCC resolution 20.02: Ensure Course Cost Transparency for Students
 - Assembly Bill 2624 (CA, proposed 02/22)

- "Low-cost" varies by college, population, location
- CSU's Affordable Learning \$olutions (AL\$): <\$50
- Most CCCs: \$40
- SDICCA:
 - Palomar: \$40
 - MiraCosta: \$40
 - Mesa: \$40
 - City: \$40


