Participatory Governance Committee Reports

College Council -

- College Council was tasked with reviewing the introduction to the handbook, to include the College Council charge.
- Extensive changes to norms were made.

Budget Committee -

Budget Committee elected Dawn Hueft as our co-chair in September. The VPAS is the other co-chair, and unfortunately, due to the retirement of Bill McGreevy, our committee has not met for the past two months. We hope to reconvene soon, as we are working on important changes in the handbook. This includes shifting the responsibilities of the budget committee to prioritizing budget requests as opposed to simply making recommendations.

Facilities Committee - Michael Bacon and Jennifer Bennett

- The FC is working on scoring this year's FPRs (Faculty Project Requests) now. If any department would like to make a request next year the deadline for submitting section 1 (the feasibility study) is <u>June 1st 2023.</u>
- 2. Building 36 construction is coming along and should be completed late Spring 2023.
- 3. Building 51 and 55 renovations should begin in the Summer or Fall 2023 and will last through Spring or Summer 2025.
- 4. State Bill AB 367 provides free menstrual products for college students and staff. Nine free self-service machines will be installed in men's and women's restrooms by the end of the year.
- 5. SDG&E should connect the solar panels above the parking lots between December and late February.
- 6. A whole campus electricity shut down will be on **Sunday**, **Dec 18th** (formally Nov 20th) for the solar project. This is unrelated to SDG&E. Time and duration are unknown at this point.
- 7. Water will be shut down in building 51 for the foreseeable future due to an underground water leak in between buildings 51 and 42. Facilities is still waiting on contracts for this project.

Student Success & Equity -

- 1. Student Equity Plan (SEP) was presented to College Council, ASGC and Governing Board on 11/8.
 - a. Feedback from ASGC
 - i. a desire to consider students with disabilities in equity in conversation
 - ii. They want faculty and student services to know how to better engage with students with disabilities
 - iii. Students pointed out negative and harmful interactions with faculty and staff.
- 2. SEP will be routed for signatures and will be submitted on 11/30
- 3. There is a need for the Student Success and Equity Committee to develop a timeline and a plan for those who will actually be implementing it.
