10 10.1 10.2	<p>Special Reports Guided Pathways – Cindi Harris, Gary Johnson & Michael McHan Public Comment on Guided Pathways – June Yang – Thanked Guided Pathways for their hard work. Shared concerns from the State regarding Guided Pathways and its focus on transfer pathways. Lifelong learning is important along with transfer and workforce development. Would like to see a focus on undeclared majors. Understands potential impact regarding financial aid but hopes to see more attention in addition to lifelong learners. Cindi Harris – Thanked June and provided some history regarding her involvement with Guided Pathways. Many students apply to the college but don't enroll. Persistence and retention rates have been low even prior to pandemic. 85% of students who apply claim to be at the college to get a degree and transfer. Curious about concerns from the state. Important to focus on providing students the right support when they enroll at our college. An important piece is our website. Shared pilot website, which included career exploration and business program as an example. Bonnie gave kudos to the committee and shared that she was involved with Guided Pathways from the beginning and it's a lot of work. English learners and lifelong learning will be included, but it is important to focus first on the 85% of students who want to get a degree or transfer.</p> <p>Resolution on Compressed Calendar – Lara Braff & Richard Unis Lara shared a presentation on calendar alignment resolution developed by herself, Richard Unis and Raquel Jacob-Almeida from Cuyamaca College. Shared information advocating for support of a compressed calendar. Reminded everyone that Grossmont College voted in support of compressed calendar five years ago, but Cuyamaca did not. More support is being expressed now. If the resolution is approved, the union will negotiate a calendar with our administration. Concern expressed with trusting administration to create a calendar that faculty will support. Reminder that union will negotiate. Another faculty member reminded that there is an issue of student equity because it is costing them more money to be in school more weeks. Another</p>

(Presentation and Resolution in attachments)</p> <p>BP/AP 3050 & 3060: Institutional Code of Ethics – Natalie Ray & Joan Ahrens Provided background on review process and decision to combine two policies into one. Has been reviewed and revised by a Districtwide committee and would like vote approval from Senate before moving to District for final approval. Reviewed edits to policy. Changed some of the punitive and negative tone in the language.</p>
10.4	<p>Resolution on Masks & Vaccinations – Bonnie Ripley Public comment on Resolution on Masks & Vaccinations – Steve Davis on behalf of Denise Schulmeyer. Request to pay close attention to resolution and potential impact on colleagues. Unaccommodated exemptions will be re-evaluated in the next few weeks. Request to take information back to departments and discuss thoroughly prior to voting at the next Senate meeting.</p> <p>Bonnie Ripley – Fear expressed from colleagues in department that District would rescind mask and vaccine mandate during the summer when faculty are out. Support ongoing mask and vaccine mandate, but request that unvaccinated employees be allowed to work from home and not be pushed out of their job. A faculty member encouraged those interested in supporting to speak at the next Governing Board meeting at Cuyamaca.</p>
