4. Curriculum Institute Share-out

- a. Karen Hern- Transcription for CPL (credit for prior learning) options is still under discussion.
- b. Sharon Sampson- IDEAA included in the PCAH 8th edition. ASCCC is pushing IDEAA in the curriculum, focusing on CORs (Course Outlines of Record). The state has a STEM taskforce tasked with reviewing curriculum for IDEAA.
- c. Vanesa Willcoxon- Moving to a Standardized attendance accounting method will simplify scheduling and not penalize departments for flexible offerings.
- d. Dee Aceves- Inclusion of Lifelong learning and exercise science is widely considered a valuable addition to Title 5
- e. Carl Fieldon- The Evaluation of Distance Ed session covered the Peralta Equity rubric. We should consider how to apply this in our DE course design. The Anti-Racist Pedagogy in Math session discussed a statistic showing that institutional barriers and micro-aggressions have impact on Math class success
- f. June Yang- Ethnic studies breakout was a great networking opportunity to learn fro colleagues and share best practices.
