What is a Key Performance Indicator?



- A set of specific metrics that reflect aspects of student success
 - Multiple KPIs are used to evaluate our college success and if we are reaching our targets
 - High-level KPIs: focus on overall performance (persistence)
 - Low-level KPIs focus on processes (number of training sessions per year)




- Provide information that can be digested
- Extracted and organized by activity or process
 Are static





- Offer comparative insights that guide future actions
 - Incorporate goals and objectives
 - Can be evaluated and reset over time

Key Performance Indicator (KPI) Dictionary

- Designed to be used by anyone not just the CPIE/RPIE team
- Will include background info and context on disaggregation
- Entry for each indicator will include
 - Metric definitions
 - Suggested data sources (annotated w/ best uses and limitations/caveats)
 - Suggestions for leading indicators that can be influenced by individuals or departments



How can we influence the results?


Leading Indicators

- Hard to measure and easy to influence
- Data points are frequent and informative –
 helps us adjust and change course in moment
- Lead to bigger picture

Lagging Indicators

- Easy to measure but hard to influence
- Focuses on the outcome not what is currently happening
