Lida shared a document about listening before members shared their stories. Listening with intent to learn Listening is a skill Listen with an openness to learning Listen with curiosity Focus on your own experiences and feelings Stay present Guard against the learned tendency to disengage Be willing to change and learn Recognize that discomfort often leads to real growth Expect and accept nondisclosure Suspend judgement Christen recommended following these rules from the book, Four Agreements for Courageous Conversations: speak our truth, listen in the present, and be okay with discomfort and nondisclosure. Each member shared their feelings and experiences with the group.	

	NEW BUSINESS		
5.	Zoom Norms	 Members to stay on mute when not speaking; Hand raising feature: This will allow members to not speak over each other and allow people their time to speak. Lida and Maite will monitor this feature; Reactions: This feature can be used to agree with someone's comment (Thumbs Up) or for applause; Chat: Chat should be used if a member has something to contribute that does not add something new. If it is something important, it was suggested that the member talk about it with the committee; Video: While having video off to save bandwidth is fine, it was suggested turning the video on when speaking; Recording: It was asked whether we want to record the meetings. It was agreed that we already have meeting notes therefore a recording is not necessary. Be mindful of how much time you take speaking when we have large discussions. It was stated that in future meetings the co-chairs will be asking members to take a deep dive inward and to be vulnerable, and asked members to maintain confidentiality and respect. Lorena reminded the group that it is always good to remember that we are not arguing with each other but rather representing our constituency groups.
