Members inevitably bend towards the power base interests. How can we establish norms and protocols to ensure that a constituency group of 80 members has the same voice as one with 1000's?</p> <p>A recommendation was put forth for SSEC to do A Barrier Analysis about the effort politically, structurally, and culturally. Document the results, inform all stakeholders and try again. This learning opportunity would enable and empower this committee to act. Set a timeline and build up this committee to be strong and stay the is your deadline.</p> <p>Frustration was expressed regarding the handling of CARES funds. We have members on SSEC that understand the regulations regarding institutional funds. The monies were held back and students suffered. The recommendation was made where SSEC would be allocated a budget to fund activity/intervention proposals for quick dollar funding.
